This letter intends to answer any questions or concerns you may have prior to sending your camper to Forest Home. Theme

Check-In & Arrival

First Aid & Medical Forms

Medical Forms are online in our system and MUST be completed prior to campers arriving on camp property. Campers who do not have a completed medical form will NOT BE ABLE TO PARTICIPATE IN CAMP. It is recommended that you log-in to your camper's online account and verify that you have fully completed your camper's online medical form PRIOR to your departure for camp. This section will need to include current medical diagnosis and medication your camper will need for camp. We must strictly enforce this policy not only to be in accordance with the law, but to ensure safety of all our guests. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

Each camper is required to undergo a health screening before arriving at camp. Please note, any ill campers or counselors should not come to camp until they are symptom free for 24 hours. If a camper or counselor arrives ill or becomes ill at camp, they may be sent home, subject to the camp nurse discretion and first aid policies.

All medications must be in their original containers for both prescriptions and over the counter (OTC) storebought medications. **All prescriptions must have their correct prescription labels**. All OTC medications must be age appropriate (adult formula vs. children's formula). If your child is not in the category to take adult-strength OTC medication, First Aid will be unable to administer that adult-strength medication unless a separate physician's

Please Note: Forest Home First Aid reserves the right to not dispense any over the counter medication, homeopathies, herbals, or essential oils, as well as any medication OTC or prescription not sent appropriately.

Dietary Needs & Allergies

Our Guest Dining team is passionate about providing for your camper's dietary needs during their stay and our online registration system will make this an easy process for your family. Please ensure that all dietary requests are indicated on your camper's online registration form.

Our chefs are trained and able to accommodate the following common dietary allergies: gluten free diets, dairy intolerances, egg allergies, vegetarian diets, vegan diets, and nut allergies (all our kitchens are nut free facilities).

If your camper has a dietary need or allergy that our kitchen is unable to accommodate for (like Celiac Disease), we require that your camper brings their own food to meet their dining needs during their stay. If your camper is bringing their own food to camp, pack their pre-cooked meals in preportioned microwave safe containers. There are refrigerators for storage and microwaves for heating in all dining facilities for guests to use. If your camper is bringing their own food, please send it in appropriate containers for travel and ensure that it is labeled with your camper's name.

We understand many allergies can be very severe, and we cannot fully guarantee that every item served is 100% free from airborne particles or other means of food allergy cross-contamination. The process of bringing your own pre-cooked and pre-portioned food will limit the chance of any allergy cross-contamination.



There are other areas in camp that may cause allergic reactions that are out of our control, such as in retail food locations, vending machines, or other campers that may bring snacks. Our desire is that every guest has a great food and dining experience while at Forest Home. Expectations on Electronics

Because of our commitment to **providing our campers with sanctuary and solitude**, Forest Home is striving to be a cellphone free destination as much as possible. This means that we will continue to encourage campers to leave all electronics (including cellphones) at home and ask that all our guests join us in our efforts to keep our public areas at Forest Home cellphone free.

Pre-Arrival

Information

Forest Home will provide phone service campers who need to contact their parents / guardians, but generally speaking, campers are not able to make or receive phone calls during camp. If there is a situation with your child at camp that warrants contact of their guardian (homesickness, injury, not cooperating, etc.), you will be contacted by our camp staff immediately.

Spending Money & eGiftcards

All of your camper's main activities while at Forest Home are covered by their camp registration expenses. There will be a few opportunities during the week where campers can choose to purchase items at an additional expense; these items include souvenirs from our shop, The Roundhouse (t-shirts, stickers, hats, etc.); snacks / drinks from The Clubhouse and Stagecoach Coffee Shop; and crafts / activities to do at our Craft Cabin. If a camper does not bring spending money with them, they will still have a full week with everything they need!

All of Forest Home's retail transactions are cashless; all retail purchases must be made by credit card, debit card, Forest Home giftcard, or eGiftcard. This <u>link</u> allows you to load or reload money on to your camper's account at any time before or during camp. You have the option of adding a telephone number to the account, making it easier for your camper to memorize the number required for making a purchase (for efficiency and ease of use, we strongly recommend using this method). For more instructions or troubleshooting on eGiftcards, watch <u>this video</u>.

At the end of camp, if your camper does not spend all the money on their eGiftcard, it will remain open so that your camper can use it the next time they are at camp. In the event your camper is not returning to camp within a 12-month period, you can also email refunds@foresthome.org to request a refund for the extra funds on your camper's eGiftcard. We are only able to process refunds that are requested within 12 months of date of purchase.





Camper Mail

Due to the nature of the US Postal Service and the historically slow delivery time from the post office to camp, we encourage parents and guardians to send their camper mail in one of two ways:

- 1. Pack any letters, cards, or packages in your camper's suitcase for them to find once they arrive at camp.
- 2. Group leaders are encouraged to collect all camper mail for their church / group on departure day. Guardians can give camper mail to their group leader, ensuring that each piece of camper mail is labeled with the camper's name and desired delivery day.

If you choose to send mail via USPS and it does not make it to your camper in time, Forest Home is not responsible.

Bunk1 – Camper Communication Platform

We offer the ability to send messages using Bunk Notes. Your note will be delivered to the camp within 24 hours. No need to wait for snail mail: Bunk1 makes it easy to communicate with your child.

- 1. We have already set you up with a Bunk1 account to link with your **Forest Home** account.
- 2. Go to www.bunk1.com or download the Bunk1 Mobile App.
- 3. Log in using the same credentials that you use to access your Forest Home account.

You will be prompted to select a bundle for access to your Parent Portal. Bundles include credits for you to send Bunk Notes and enhance your notes with borders, photos, sports scores, and puzzles.

SENDING BUNK NOTES

Send Bunk Notes day or night! Your camp receives a pdf at **8:00 am PST** each day containing all Bunk Notes received in the last 24 hours. Camp prints each Bunk Note and delivers them to your camper with the regular mail. You can purchase more credits anytime in the Bunk Notes menu. Successfully sent Bunk Notes will appear under Bunk Notes > View Sent.



The Bunk1 team is available to support you 7 days a week during peak season. They guarantee a response within 24 hours and it's usually much quicker than that. Please call Bunk1 at **212-974-9112** or email support@bunk1.com. For FAQ's related to the services above, visit www.bunk1family.com/faqs.

Camper Photos

Photos can be accessed through a link provided by your group's group leader. This link will be sent directly to the group leader a few days before arriving at camp. It is the group leader's responsibility to share that link with camper families. If you do not receive the link directly from your group leader, follow up with them for photo access! For individual campers, the same scenario will play out except through the individual camper's parent / guardian rather than group leader.

A Safe Place

At Forest Home, we deeply care about the safety of our campers in every regard. For this reason, we have a closed campus. Because of space and liability issues, please do not instruct anyone to come up to camp (for ANY length of time) who is not a registered guest. Day passes are not available unless pre-arranged with the Camp Director. Your cooperation with this will be extremely helpful in keeping our campers safe. Emergencies – If there is a serious family emergency and a parent needs to contact their child while at camp, they may contact the **Forest Home Roundhouse at 909-389-2300** and they can put them in contact with the Camp Director.

Check-Out / Departure

Check-out will take place at the conclusion of the Summer Camp Program at 11:00AM on Friday at the same location at which you checked-in your camper. Our program will end promptly at 11:00AM; please do not plan on leaving prior to 11:00AM as it disrupts program. Week 1 Individual Campers – **When picking up an individual camper, you must bring a valid photo ID**. We will not be able to release your camper if the ID of the person picking up your camper does not match the name of an emergency contact listed on your camper's registration profile. If you have appointed another family member or someone else to pick up your child, please ensure that this person is listed as an emergency contact for your camper on their online Forest Home account.

Packing Pro-Tips:

- Label all luggage items with your camper's full name and church / group name (if attending with a group)
- Make sure your camper can carry all the luggage they are bringing to camp.
- Check the weather before sending your camper to camp Forest Falls can be hot, dry, cool, rainy, or muddy throughout the summer help your camper pack accordingly!

Packing List:

- The Essentials:
 - Sleeping Bag & Pillow
 - Bible, Journal, Pen (make sure your camper's name is in their Bible)
 - Bath Towel & Washcloth
 - Beach Towel for Pool and Lake Activities
 - Flashlight or Headlamp (with new batteries)
 - Reusable Water Bottle (labeled with your camper's name)
- General Toiletries:
 - Toothbrush & Toothpaste
 - Shampoo & Conditioner





- Soap / Body Wash
- Deodorant
- Sunscreen / Bug Repellent

• Clothing for Five Days:

- Socks & Underwear
- Swimsuit (guys trunks // girls one-pieces)
- T-Shirts
- Shorts
- Pajamas
- Pants / Sweatshirt (for if it gets chilly at camp)
- Sandals AND closed-toed shoes
- Raincoat / Poncho (rain is not uncommon at camp, being prepared with rain gear can be helpful)
- Old clothes / old closed-toed shoes to get dirty in the Mudbowl (HS Only)

• Optional / Encouraged:

- Hat for Sun Protection
- Small Backpack for carrying personal items around camp
- Plastic garbage bag for dirty clothing
- **Corresponding Color Team Gear:** During the week, we will have team competitions where campers will compete on their assigned color teams. Team spirit is an exciting part of these competitions, so we encourage campers to wear their team's color! We will contact group leaders (and guardians of individual campers) with your camper's assigned color prior to camp.





- **Retro Video Game Themed Items:** This summer, our "Pixelated Life" theme is vintage video game themed! Pack any clothes, costumes, outfits, accessories that go along with our retro video game theme.

 - During the week of camp, we'll have opportunities to wear themed items at competitions, our dance party, and a themed dinner.
- Please Leave the Following Items at Home:
 - Electronic Gaming Systems (Nintendo Switch, PSP, etc.)
 - Laptops / iPads / Tablets
 - Weapons including firearms, knives, airsoft guns, bb guns, etc.
 - Drug / Alcohol / Tobacco Paraphernalia including juuls, vapes, dab pens, and wax pens.
 - Avoid preventable heartache: do not send anything to camp that is irreplicable, such as a treasured stuffed animal or blanket, or a \$1,000 camera. These items are easily lost or damaged at camp and we cannot guarantee their safe return.
